About the Study

- A phone survey was conducted on a national representative sample of 3056 Egyptians 15+ distributed in all the Egyptian governorates.
- Respondents were accessed during the period from 2 August to 11 August 2022.
- A second round of the survey was conducted from 30 October to 3 November 2022.
- In addition to 14 in-depth interviews with private sector and 14 FGDs with Farmers, teachers, youth, people with disability, and citizens of mega cities.





• Long-term campaigns to raise the awareness of Egyptians about climate change.


















Do you think that increasing temperature or cold weather will have negative impact on the future of life in Egypt?













The Egyptian government needs to ...

Has climate change affected your life?









The Egyptian government needs to ...









The Egyptian government needs to ...

provide the necessary budgets for broadcasting campaigns through Egyptian satellite channels and social media.



































The Egyptian government needs to ...

People with Disability








Special attention should be given to PWD

They seem to be affected by climate change than people without disability which requires tailored interventions to reduce these impacts.





Farmers' FGDs

The Egyptian government needs to ...

- provide interventions to reduce the financial impact of climate change on farmers.
- increase awareness about climate change through TV channels, and local units as farmers don't use social media.



As a farmer, do not know how or when or what to plant anymore as extreme cold kills crops in winter and extreme heat kills them in summer. Extreme temperatures do not give a chance for the plants to grow and bear fruit. This has increased a lot in the last 3 years."

Teachers' FGDs

The Egyptian government needs to ...

- include Climate change in the syllabus as a major subject starting from the primary level.
- provide well-equipped classrooms and buildings to face climate change challenges and hazards, such as good heating and ventilating systems.



Students need the incentive, know-how, tools, and resources to learn to deal with climate change and protect the environment, and teachers through accredited, recognized, and evaluated workshops and trainings.







Business sectors' in-depth interviews

The Egyptian government needs to ...

- provide more research to find new solutions for crop damage, rehybridization of crop cultivation, and creation of improved seedlings.
- issue laws to monitor and penalize any form of environmental injustice and violation
- make use of Egypt's constant sun and convert fossil fuels to solar energy, make solar cells, and export electricity and wind energy.



"Climate change affected cotton. Cotton affected the fabric. We used to get about 12 quintals now I'm putting down 5 quintals. Of course, the climate change has affected agriculture now. So, we keep importing textiles because cotton cultivation died."

"I can't do anything on my own. The state must support factories and investors to provide solar cells for us at simple prices or in installments over long periods."
